From the Pastor

"Whether you are joining us in person or online..."

These are words that I have become all too familiar with, now as much a part of church as the hymns, the prayers, and the sermon. Words that would have been unheard of (literally) just a few short years ago, at least in most churches. Undoubtedly, the pandemic forced us all to pivot to digital forms of ministry, including livestreamed and recorded worship. What was – and still is – a steep learning curve with unpredictable, technological hurdles is also in many ways a *gift*, enabling those who are unable to be present in person – whether by distance, illness, or other physical limitations – to participate in worship.

And yet, as I lamented to a group of colleagues recently, I miss the simple, innocent days of "analog church." I miss not having to worry about whether the camera will freeze, or the Internet will fail, or some other ungodly technological hurdle will befall us. (If you worshipped online on Palm Sunday or the Third Sunday of Easter, you know what I'm talking about.)

Which leads me to an observation: *There is no substitute for in person worship.* To be clear, our livestream isn't going anywhere anytime soon – as much as there are days when I'd like to throw the whole AV desk into the middle of Sand Creek Road at rush hour.

Soon, the choir's season will end, and summer vacations and camps will commence. In the midst of the inevitable *slump* of summer church, I want to invite you to church. *In person worship.*

Experience the *embodied* liturgy and practicing your faith in *community*. *Hear* the hymns. *Smell* the incense. *Taste* the sweetness of the Eucharist. *Feel* the cool touch of water in the font. See the worshipping assembly – friends, family, visitors – around you.

The livestream will be there (most of the time) when you need it, but join us *in person* if you can for "analog church." Our summer season kicks off with our first ALT: Sunday Together on June 22, right here at St. John's (see page 4 for details). You don't want to miss it!

Important Congregation Staffing Updates: We Thank Maggie Anderson & Shea Stannard

"For everything there is a season," the writer of Ecclesiastes famously reminds us, and as shared in a recent email announcement, we acknowledge the conclusion of a particular season in the life of our congregation. Effective June 30, Maggie Anderson will conclude her service as Community Care Coordinator (formerly Parish Secretary) as a part of the ministry team of St. John's.

This decision is not one made lightly, but comes after much reflection and deliberation among our council leaders. We recognize the ways congregational life has changed and is changing, and with it also the shifting needs and realities of congregational leadership and staffing. This was made evident by the transition last year from Parish Secretary to Community Care Coordinator, and now we are recognizing yet another shift.

At the same time, we also give thanks for and celebrate Maggie's many contributions to the life of our congregation and for her unwavering commitment to the ministry and people of St. John's. Having seen this congregation through the move from our historic building to the chapel campus, as well as providing crucial administrative coverage during a pastoral transition, there is no doubt that Maggie's presence has proven indispensable in this season.

Looking ahead, Maggie will continue to fully function as Community Care Coordinator through June 30, and we will plan to give thanks for her ministry and formally mark its conclusion in worship on Sunday, June 29, followed by a festive coffee hour reception in her honor. Beyond that, Maggie will of course continue to remain a valued and active member of our church community.

Secondly, also effective at the end of June, we will say farewell to Shea Stannard, our Worship AV Tech nearly every Sunday for the past two years, as he looks ahead to his freshman year at Quinnipiac University in Hamden, Connecticut. Originally contracted to help with our website, Shea's position shifted in summer 2023 to running our livestream worship, enabling those who cannot be present with us in person to worship with us online.

For Shea's faithful behind-the-scenes ministry these last two years, we give thanks. Going forward, we will not seek to hire a new paid staff person to replace Shea, but instead will use existing worship volunteers to operate our weekly livestream. We will also take time to recognize and bless our high school graduates, Shea included, in worship on June 15.

Building Renovation ~ By Karen Bielinski

Phase I of our building renovation project has formally begun! St.

John's has engaged the services of Studio Seven Architects of Albany. John Van Oort, principal architect, has completed the design for the new garage. A new garage will be constructed in the rear of the cemetery to house cemetery equipment, which will also include a small office (and bathroom) for our Cemetery Superintendent to meet with lot purchasers and family members planning for burials.

Unfortunately, in preliminary discussions with the Town of Colonie, it appears we may need a variance to build the garage, which is not a permitted use at this time. As of newsletter printing (May 30), a Zoning Verification has been submitted to the Town Building Department, the first step in the often arduous process to secure a Building Permit. The zoning variance may slow the process up a bit, as a public hearing may be required, but we hope to secure the building permit and start construction this summer.

When garage construction has begun, John Van Oort will have commenced/completed the plan to renovate the current garages once they're empty and we'll begin the process again to secure a building permit for the renovation itself. We anticipate that process will move forward quicker.

They say patience is a virtue – don't lose hope! We're working hard to complete our fellowship space and update our worship area as quickly as we can.

Relive the Music of Maundy Thursday!

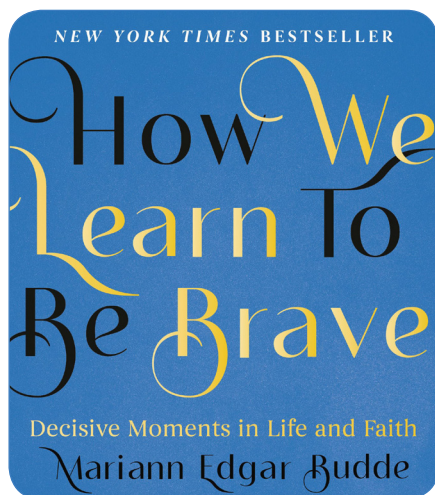

NEW! Join us for ALT: Sundays Together! First One to Be Held on June 22 at St. John's

What a joy it was to worship together this Lent and Easter! Each week in Lent, we gathered from all four of our congregations for supper and evening prayer, sharing the Christian life with each other across congregations. On Holy Saturday, for the second year in a row, all four of our congregations came together for the Great Vigil of Easter. We sang together. We prayed together. We experienced the profundity of heavy rain arriving in the middle of Karen Lapierre reading the prophet Isaiah's words about God bringing water to the thirsty. We toasted the risen Christ together.

To keep this energy and collaboration going and not wait until Advent to worship together again, we're trying an experiment this year: four Sundays, between now and next March, on which all four congregations worship together on Sunday morning. These will be normal Sundays, avoiding high festivals, Advent, and Lent. We're not juggling times and scheduling worship leaders from all the churches. The plan is simply this: about once a quarter, all four congregations will worship together at one congregation's location and time, and in that congregation's normal way of worshiping

The first ALT: Sundays Together is June 22, when we'll all gather at St. John's for worship at 9:30 am. First, Good Shepherd, and Holy Spirit won't have worship at their building that day, and all the pastors will be at St. John's, with everyone else.

- September 21 at Good Shepherd
- January 4 at Holy Spirit
- March 1 at First Lutheran

Stay tuned for further invitations and reminders to come.

We have such great worship together, let's keep that going on Sundays Together and keep growing and walking in faith as Albany Lutherans Together!

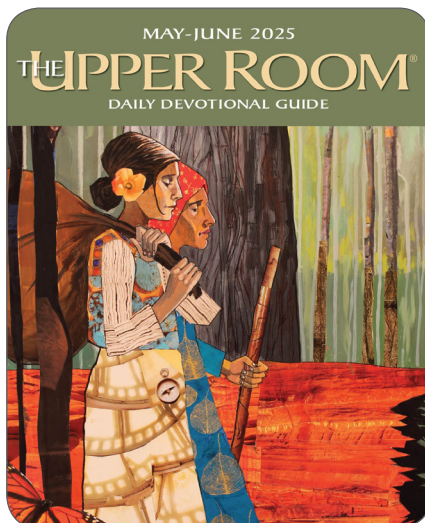
Enjoy Our New Courtyard Furniture!

Please Note These New Worship Volunteer Changes

As of the current schedule, we are transitioning from Planning Center Services to Ministry Scheduler Pro. We hope this will be an easier to use tool for our volunteers and better suited to our specific needs at St. John's.

To that end:

(Tip: Click on each ministry/worship role for a brief description of that role before adding it to your preferences. You can also check the box "I only want to sub in this ministry" to avoid being automatically scheduled in a particular role(s).)

- **EXISTING** volunteers log in [HERE](#) to view your schedule, request subs, sign up for open slots, and set "can't serve" dates. (Tip: You can change your contact info and serving preferences, including worship roles, from the "My Profile" tab.)

View the current schedule through June 15 [HERE](#) and June 22 through August 31 [HERE](#). (Also posted on the bulletin board at church.) Please submit any blockout dates for JULY by Friday, JUNE 20.
