From the Pastor

It's been an exciting *and packed* summer at St. John's!

Back in June, we welcomed Bishop Lee Miller as our guest preacher for Pride Sunday, and then several of us took to the streets - literally! - to march in the Capital Pride Parade to bear witness to God's extravagant love for all people. In July, we enjoyed our second annual "Lutheran Night" at the Tri-City VallevCats (Vamos Gatos!). and we welcomed Mother Grace Ferris for a special faith formation event with our fellow Albany-area Lutherans. More recently, we also enjoyed the music of Spencer LaJoye at a small listening concert at the chapel, and Albany Lutherans Together experienced the amazing collection at The Clark Art Institute in Williamstown, MA.

Often we assume (clearly incorrectly) that summer is the "slump" of the church year. Not so at St. John's! Our life together in these summer months has been vibrant, and for this, I am grateful. The very pages of this newsletter are a testament to that. Even as we were preparing this edition, trying to cram in all the content and photos we wanted to include, it occurred to us:

No matter how "small" our congregation is, St. John's is still involved in a BIG way – and it's what continues to make us *relevant*.

That's not just a buzzword I throw around lightly either. Around the time I graduated college, I landed in a fairly new (at the time) United Methodist church plant in Chicago. Every week, as the pastor or another worship leader welcomed folks to the service, they would remind us of our community's core values (which, I would propose, are also *our* core values).

We are *bold* in our proclamation of the good news of Jesus Christ that tears down the walls that divide us; *inclusive* because of that good news; and *relevant* in the way we live our faith in our "Monday through Friday" lives. On the one hand, it's *all* about what we do on Sundays – and it's also *not just* what we do on Sundays. Through Word and Sacrament, we are *filled* with God's grace *one day* out of the week *in order to embody that grace* for the people around us *every day* of the week.

This fall at St. John's, we've got lots of unique worship opportunities coming up, all kicking off with Rally Day on September 8. Then come back in the middle of the week for Lunch Bunch or Faith on Tap to connect with each other *outside* of the pews.

I'm excited to continue living this meaningful and relevant faith with you all – in Sunday worship and beyond.

Saint John's Collegium ~ from Dan Foster

"David spake to the chief of the Levites to appoint their brethren to be the singers with instruments of musick, psalteries and harps and cymbals, sounding, by lifting up the voice with joy." ~ 1 Chronicles 15:16

Dear Congregation of Saint John's ~ I know you're as thrilled as we are that choir will resume on Sunday, September 8.

As Christians, we can trace our sung faith back at least as far as our roots in ancient Judaism: in Solomon's Temple (completed in the 10th century B.C.), the Levites – musicians and shleppers in the Temple – stood on opposite staircases to sing The Psalms, just as we do in the Summer when we chant in alternation – *Sand Creek Road side/Saint John's Cemetery side*, and when the choir is in session – Choir/Full; Choir/Full. Thousands of years later, it's still among our greatest joys to *Serve the LORD with gladness: come before his presence with singing* (Psalm 100:2), and to lead our congregation in worship, for "He who sings prays twice."

In the coming months, we will reintroduce each member of Saint John's Collegium, starting with this season's High School Choral Apprentice, MAURA LANDER:



Maura developed a passion for singing and musical theater at the ripe old age of 11. Now 17 (one year younger than her friend Mikayla Malenfant), she has just begun her senior year at Averill Park High School. Like Mikayla, she hopes to attend the Crane School of Music to pursue a career in music education. She's been studying with me for over a year and is very excited to be a part of a fine church choir where she will learn a great many things about ensemble singing, best practices for

sacred choir formation and development, a depth of repertoire that one can't access in high school choir, and the importance of music and worship.

- Dinner is served in CC375 from 6:00-6:45 pm. We begin with prayer and then serve buffet-style and eat like a big family around our table in the community room.
- During the meal, folks are asked to make introductions, and we encourage conversation; it's a great opportunity for us to get to know the students and for them to get to know us, their congregational partners.
- Then at 6:45, St. John's leads approx. 30 minutes of interactive worship/devotions/reflection, etc.
- At 7:15 we clean up and are out the door by 7:30.




First Lutheran Book Club

St. John's Cemetery Updates

This is just a reminder: All summer decorations must be removed from gravesites at St. John's Cemetery by Tuesday, October 1.

We have contracted with a company to digitize our cemetery records. Lazarus Cemetery Mapping took new aerial shots via drone to capture new cemetery maps and will be scanning all our paper ledgers to create an easily searchable database. The project should hopefully be completed by late February or early March 2025.

Did you know...? St. John's Cemetery and Chapel are "home" to much history. In 1873 the congregation bought 20 acres of land on Sand Creek Road for cemetery purposes. The cemetery was dedicated in the spring of 1874, a chapel was built at its entrance and a branch Sunday School was organized. Services were conducted in St. John's Chapel, beginning in the Spring of 1881. The bell, which for years tolled in the chapel belfry, summoning worshipers and Sunday School students, is now permanently mounted in a rear portion of the cemetery.


