#### From the Pastor

One of my favorite excerpts from the writings of the late Howard Thurman, a well-known Black theologian, educator, and civil rights leader, goes like this:

When the song of the angels is stilled, when the star in the sky is gone, when the kings and princes are home, when the shepherds are back with their flocks, the work of Christmas begins: to find the lost, to heal the broken, to feed the hungry, to release the prisoner, to rebuild the nations, to bring peace among the people, to make music in the heart.

When you put it that way, it's like the "work of Christmas" is the work of the church *year-round*.

At Christmas, we celebrate the eternal Word of God, taking on human flesh and bone in the person of Jesus of Nazareth, who comes to dwell with us, who "moves into the neighborhood" (as Eugene Peterson's *Message* paraphrase of the Bible puts it). At Christmas, we remember how much God so loves the world that God chose to become one of us, to live with us, in spite of everything. No matter what's going on in the world, in our neighborhoods, in our churches, or in our homes, *this work of the church continues*. Whether we are preparing a meal for our siblings right here in Albany who find refuge at the overflow homeless shelter, or we are putting together gift boxes for seafarers from around the world whom we might never meet, we are doing the work of the church – at Christmastime and beyond. This is the work of embodying Christ's love in our communities to which each of us, right where we are, is called.

Over the next few weeks, as the Christmas season kicks into gear, we'll have several opportunities to gather together as the people of God for worship, fellowship, and service – our second annual Advent Fest, midweek compline with Albany Lutherans Together, a Blue Christmas/Longest Night service with our ministry partners at Good Shepherd, our AMAZING all-ages Christmas pageant, and of course, that "silent night, holy night" of Christmas Eve worship.

There is truly a place for YOU this season at St. John's. I look forward to seeing you there!

#### NRSVUE Orders due Jan. 5

The newly updated version of the widelyused translation of the Bible - the New **Revised Standard Version (NRSV, now** NRSVUE) - is now available in print. The NRSVUE reflects discoveries of ancient texts and new insights and offers clearer, more direct, and inclusive language, and increased cultural sensitivity. This version gives English Bible readers access to the most meticulously researched, rigorously reviewed, and faithfully accurate translation on the market. It is also the most ecumenical Bible, with acceptance by Christian churches of Protestant, Anglican, Roman Catholic, Eastern Orthodox, African American, and Evangelical traditions - and it is the version we use in our worship services at St. John's.

Opportunities are now available to sponsor a pew edition for use at St. John's and/ or to purchase a personal/gift copy. Pew editions are available for \$17 each; personal/gift editions are \$20.

#### Miss the Cantata November 24? Catch it Now

On Sunday, November 24, Saint John's Collegium premiered Music Director Dan Foster's new Thanksgiving Cantata – Psalm 136 – "Oh, give thanks to the Lord, for He is good!" Inspired primarily by the music of Jean Baptiste Lully and that greatest of all composers and Lutheran, Johann Sebastian Bach, Dan composed a cantata in the Baroque style. It contained choruses, arias, and a duet. #### **Messages in the Post-Election Season**



The following is a brief excerpt from "Four Messages for Children, Teens, and Families in the Post-Election Season" by the Rev. Dr. Leah D. Schade, ELCA pastor and seminary professor. For the full article, CLICK HERE.

The 2024 election season has been one of the most contentious in American history. Children, teens, and their families may be

looking to their pastors and congregations for guidance on what to know and how to respond to the results of the election. Even more importantly, they need insights about how their faith can shape their actions at home, school, and in church, especially given the divisiveness they may be seeing in their communities....

So how can ministry leaders talk with children, teens, and families about the election results in a way that conveys a non-anxious presence as well as a strong faith in an uncertain time? I suggest four messages that clergy and other congregational leaders can communicate to children, youth, and their loved ones in the postelection season:

Message 1: Every person matters to God. So be a good neighbor.

- Message 2: God wants us and others to be safe.
- Message 3: Our words matter to God.
- Message 4: Even though the election season brought out the worst in some people, it also brought out the best in others.

# Here are three additional things to keep in mind when talking to your children, youth, and families in this post-election season:

- 1. Be cautious about insisting that people need to "come together" when safety is at risk.
- 2. The liturgy is God's holding space for us.
- 3. The work of the church is ongoing, no matter the outcome of the election.



#### **Year-End Giving Reminders**

Donations for 2024 must be received by December 31 in order to be posted to your donor record/ giving statement for this year.

If you give online at stjohnsalbany. org/give, credit card, debit card, and ACH bank transfer donations all get a "received date" as soon as you click the "Give \$ Now" button. If that happens before the clock strikes midnight in your local time zone on December 31, then the donation will be counted for 2024. Online donations cannot be backdated. Online giving is always the easiest and most secure option. Need help setting it up? Talk to Pastor Josh.

If you prefer to give by mail, the US Treasury Department's rule (Treasury Regulation 1.170A-1(b)) states that a donation is considered delivered when it is postmarked by the USPS. All checks received by mail will be posted based on the postmarked date, not the date on the check. As always, we are so incredibly grateful for your generosity that allows us to do the ministry we do. Thank you!


